


Compost your Jack O'Lanterns, pumpkins, and mums!

Pastor Nominating Committee Monthly Update



In October, the congregation was presented with the results of the all-church survey from PneuMatrix Consultants. The PNC did a deep dive on the survey results to begin the process of developing our church's mission study.

A mission study is a prayerful process a congregation goes through to seek who God has called them to be, and the direction that God is calling them to go. It is essential for a congregation to know who it is before searching for who will guide them in the form of pastoral leadership.

The key components of a mission study are:

1. Vision: Describe the vision for the future of our church.
2. Elements of Transformation: This includes speaking about our spiritual energy, our congregational identity, our leadership both professional and volunteer, our involvement in the community, and how our present and future ministry be funded.
3. Goals and Objectives: Listing these to fulfill the vision.





We will meet the 2nd Thursday @ 9:30am in the Bird's Eye Room. Bible study books are available in the church office.



Sacred Space: Our Chapel and Columbarium

There is a special place in our church building: our Chapel and Columbarium, located just to the left after entering the main doors.

Our church's chapel contains beautiful stained glass and a Celtic cross as the focal point. It has been the site of prayer gatherings, preschool chapel story time, renewal of wedding vows, and services of Witness to the Resurrection. Church members are invited to sit and pray in the quiet space of the chapel whenever the church is open. It is also home to the final physical resting place for many of our church family who have passed into the arms of God. The columbarium in our chapel has available niches to reserve for you or your loved ones as you make end-of-life decisions.



A columbarium is a structure with recesses (niches) in the walls to receive and house the ashes of the deceased who have been cremated. Each niche includes a nameplate to memorialize departed loved ones. Generally, there is a service in the chapel when the cremains are interred, and then the chapel is available later for personal visits, to sit in peaceful remembrance and prayer. By reserving your niche ahead of time, you help your loved ones by taking care of final decisions in advance.

Report from the FPC Bentonville Commissioner to the 160th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Arkansas, October 10, 2025

Pastor Georgia, Pastor Dennis, and I attended the meeting held on October 11, at Second Presbyterian in Little Rock. We attended the worship service of Holy Communion and were treated to a thoughtful and thought-provoking sermon by Dr. Mark Douglas from Columbia Theological Seminary, as well as beautiful music from the Second Pres adult choir led by Dr. Bevan Keating.

The meeting agenda was robust with interesting reports from the various Presbytery committees. Especially interesting in this meeting:

- The Mission of the Church Committee announced that the Presbytery will support the Providence Park project in Pulaski County by donating \$50,000 through the Gary Gault Trust to build a home and by seed-funding \$25,000 for a second home in the project
- The Honduran Mission subcommittee presented actions for the Presbytery to send to the General Assembly to challenge recent decisions regarding mission work and workers. It was advised that these actions needed more background work and planning; they were voted down. The concerns and recommendations of the Honduran Mission subcommittee will be approached from a different perspective
- The Presbytery voted to allow Pulaski Heights Presbyterian to sell its property as that congregation continues to collaborate with the Westover Hills congregation
- The Presbytery voted to bring candidate Baxter Yarbrough under the care of the Presbytery of Arkansas.

The meeting was vibrant and demonstrated the church at work in a spirit of love, even as some issues were vigorously debated.

A pre-presbytery theological discussion led by Dr. Mark Douglas was hosted at Trinity Presbyterian Church the evening before the main meeting.



“The Woman at the Well Was Wronged” and “Good News from a Bad Pastor for a Better Church”

During our annual Clabaugh Speaker Series this year (October 19 & 20), we heard from the Rev. Dr. Lillian Daniel, Conference Minister for the Michigan Conference of the United Church of Christ. Her sermon on the woman at the well was captivating, with advice to the church to get outside the walls and minister to those whom society tosses aside. She said, “Jesus publicly takes the side of the person who is looked down upon.” Her challenge to us was to ask ourselves who the woman at the well is in our context. “Where is she? How do we find her and talk to her?”

Dr. Daniel’s public presentations and lunch discussion expressed her personal experience with the church in a time of crisis, and what it might mean to expand our sense of transparency and grace. She gave us much to contemplate. We look forward to her forthcoming book, due out in Spring, 2026. Her previous books are available in our church Library.
